The piano duo Horvárh-Schauser consists of Hungaro-French pianist Izabella Horvárh and Danish-Ferman pianist Ingo Schauser. Founded in 2008, they already have performed in Italy, France, Austria, Romania and Denmark and in autumn 2011 they will visit Paris, Rome, Washington, and New York.

UNSRC Aux Antilles Club was founded in 1990 by UN Haitian staff members who wanted to share their culture and that of other Caribbean countries with others. Since its existence, the Club has showcased countless talents from Haiti as well as from other countries. It has also been very present in helping raise funds for Haiti, the Dominican Republic, and recently for Japan. This gala is yet another event that the Club is organizing to present pianist duo Horvarth-Schauser along with Tabou Combo, Haiti's most famous musical group. Proceeds will go to the Luce Foundation project for Leogane, Haiti.

Tabou Combo is Haiti's most famous group. For over 30 years, they have toured worldwide and are celebrated as the 'ambassadors of Kompa' – the popular Haitian dance rhythm sung in French, English, Spanish and Creole. Tabou Combo's music is aimed squarely at the dance floor – mixing Haitian Meringue, Rara (vodoun percussion) with Kompa and elements of Brazilian music, Soukous and Funk. Their phenomenal popularity has given them an important standing in Haitian society and they use their lyrics to defend the poor people in their songs.

Their story started in 1967 in a small church in Haiti where two musicians, Albert Chancy Jr and Herman Nau, played their first show. Very soon they formed a band and went on the road, playing live all over the island and winning the Radio Haiti award for 'Best Musical Group of the Year (1969). The following year the group moved to Brooklyn, playing their first New York show in December 1970 – the beginning of a long international career.

Izabella Horvath



Izabella Horvath has been formed at the Conservatoire National Supérieur of Cluj in Romania and received her diploma as a music pedagogue and concert pianist from the Académie of Music Franz Liszt in Budapest (Hungary). She since studied at the Ecole Normale de Musique of Paris and received a Gold-medal at the Music Academies. She followed master classes in Hungary, Spain and France. In 1988 she achieved a special 1st price of the national piano competition at Tg. Mures in Romania. Izabella teaches in Toulouse and has given a great number of recitals in many countries. Together with solo-cellist from the National Opera in Budapest Laslo... Her performances have been broadcasted in the radio in Romania and Hungary.



Ingo Schauser



As a soloist, accompanist and chamber musician the pianist Ingo Schauser has given countless performances in Denmark and the rest of the world. As a recording artist he is broadcasted on radio and available on CDs. The close collaboration with the singers Liv O. Midtmageli and Johannes Mannow in the ensemble "LIEDKRAFT" is longstanding and especially fruitful, with many successful appearances. Ingo is also a member of the Glinka Trio, featuring the unusual combination of clarinet, bassoon and piano. The Glinka Trio has world premièred several works dedicated to them, many of which were broadcasted by the Danish Radio. Ingo studied at the Car Nielsen Academy of Music in Denmark, and since at the Ecole Normale de Musique of Paris and at the Ruben Academy of Jerusalem.
